You could use the notes that you made from your research to write your own biography about Beatrix's life. You might be able to remember writing a biography about John McAdam earlier in the year. We had to remember to write it in time order. You could use the subheadings that you made your notes under yesterday. Remember to use your neatest joined handwriting.

<u>Friday</u>

Perhaps you could be revising rabbits and edit and improve your work? Think about the following things.

Are there any spellings you can spot that don't look quite right?

- Does your writing make sense?
- Can you add some adverbs and adjectives to make it more interesting?
- Maybe you could add some pictures and captions?

Science wb 20.4.20

This half term we will be learning about plants and growing. There are two different things you could choose from this week.

- 1. If you have some seeds somewhere around your house or garden shed you could think of your own science investigation.
 - Start with your own question e.g. 'will seeds grow without light?' 'Would seeds grow if I
 water them with lemonade instead of water?'
 - You could set up one set of seeds with all the things you know they need to grow (plenty of light, warmth, water and soil) and one set of seeds where you change one of these things e.g. lemonade instead of water, dark instead of light.
 - You could then compare the two. Make a prediction about what you thing will happen.
 Think about how you will record your results. Could you keep a little diary, take measurements or take photos.
