Please remember your child can change their reading book by putting their wallet (with book and diary inside) in the 'reading books to be changed' box in their classroom on a **Tuesday** and/ or **Friday**. Please remember to sign to say that your child has read the book otherwise it will not be changed. Even if your child has not finished a book, please ensure that they have their reading diary and book in school every day. In school they will read with an adult as part of a guided reading group once a week.

#### Special days

We always try to celebrate special days and events in school to ensure the children learn about a broad range of topics. This half term we will be celebrating Children in Need, Remembrance Day and Christmas.

Our Christmas production will take place on **Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> December** and **Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> December** starting at 9.15am – tickets will be booked via eschools and further information will be sent out nearer the time.

Following the success of last year, we are hosting another Grandparents Christmas event which will take place on **Friday 29**<sup>th</sup> **November**. Grandparents will be able to come to either a morning or afternoon craft making session, where they will help their grandchild make a range of Christmas crafts. Tickets will be booked via eschools and further information will be sent out nearer the time.

#### Library visit

To bring our Amazing Animals topic, and Julia Donaldson learning, alive we have arranged a visit to our local library in Lillington. The children will walk to the library in their class groups. Permission for your child to visit local areas has already been provided by you. Once at the library, the children will find out how a library works and will be given a chance to explore the different types of books. They will also listen to a special story read by the librarian. We will need parent volunteers to make this visit possible, so if you are able to help, please let your child's class teacher know.
