### TEST AND TRACE OVER THE HALF TERM BREAK Message for parents of children attending school in person

If your child becomes poorly during half term and you get them tested for COVID-19 please alert us via email

admin2326@welearn365.com if:

\*the time that the **symptoms** first started was **before midnight on Sunday 14**<sup>th</sup> **February** – you will need to book a PCR COVID-19 test for your child. Please inform the school without delay if it is positive. or

\*if asymptomatic, the date of the COVID-19 test was **before midnight on Sunday 14**<sup>th</sup> **February.** 

If the date of first symptoms or if asymptomatic the date of the positive test was **Monday 15<sup>th</sup> February or later** there is no need to let us know until the start of the new half term when you will need to phone school to inform us of your child's absence due to self isolation.

The school acts on advice from Public Health England and will contact families if a bubble needs to self isolate during half term due to a positive COVID-19 test.

The school admin email will be checked for COVID-19 test related messages but please note that the school answerphone or Tapestry will <u>not</u> be monitored during half term.
