Usually in Year 2 the children perform carols at church however, this year this will not be possible under the current government guidance for schools. Further details about arrangements for Christmas will follow shortly.

Home Learning

<u>Reading</u>

Please remember to upload a comment onto Tapestry to keep us informed of the reading you are doing at home. We will also write when we listen to them read in guided reading or individually. We recommend that you try to hear your child read every day and remind them to change their book every week.

We are very fortunate to have access to eBooks on Bug Club which many of your children are reading regularly. As you are probably aware Bug Club books also have interactive comprehension questions which develops their understanding of the texts. Phonics

Cancellation of the phonics screening check in June 2020 means that it is statutory for schools to administer the phonics screening check to year 2 children during the second half of the 2020 autumn term. Year 2 pupils who meet the expected standard in phonics in the autumn check will not be required to complete any further statutory assessments in phonics. Year 2 children who do not meet the expected standard in the autumn check will be expected to take the statutory check in June 2021. The results of the phonics screening will be uploaded onto Tapestry on Monday 14th December.

<u>Uniform</u>

Please make sure that your child brings a warm, waterproof coat to school throughout the winter months, both for playtimes, and to enable us to learn outside if appropriate.

Please make sure that your child has a **named** PE kit (including jogging bottoms, jumper and trainers) in school every day as PE days can sometimes change.

Please remember that children should only wear small, plain hair accessories in blue, white, grey or black and long hair should be tied back. If children wear earrings, they should be small studs which they can remove themselves for PE. If they can't remove them then they should be able to tape them up themselves.

Water bottles

It is important that your child has a water bottle with them every day. Water bottles will continue to be sent home DAILY so that they can be washed and refilled ready for the next day. This really helps to combat the spread of germs in school and eases congestion at the water fountains in the mornings.

<u> Birthdays – a reminder</u>

We love celebrating your child's birthday with them which we do in class and as part of our Teams celebration assembly. Your child is invited to donate a book to the classroom library to share with their friends.
