They created a special person including Jesus, Guru Nanak and a Buddha, coloured in religious symbols and wrote about a special person in our lives.




They also took part in a meditation taking peaceful deep breaths in and out whilst thinking about the happiness that they bring to others.

YEAR 1

Year 1 started by exploring 'belonging' and revisited their PSHE learning to answer the question "Do we all belong to something?" They all agreed that we all belong to something. Some of these will be the same and some will be different, for example, we all go to Telford Infant School.

The children then found out how Christians show they belong. The children looked at different Christian artefacts and listened to the Christian Parable "The Lost Coin". They really enjoyed acting out the story. The children then collaborated to create fantastic posters all about Christian belonging.



In the afternoon, they learned about how Muslims show they belong. They learned about the five pillars of Islam and why they are important to people of the Muslim faith and listened to the story of "The boy who throws stones at trees".

YEAR 2

Year 2 compared how religions care for others and focused on 'The Golden Rule'. The children wrote down one way they could be kind inside a flap and decorated the outside with a heart.

They looked in detail at Christianity, Judaism and Humanism.

The children acted out the Christian story of The Good Samaritan and then welcomed some Bahi visitors.
