A huge thank you to Nathan's grandad for sharing with us the story of Nathan's great, great uncle, Captain George Sanders VC, MC & Oakleaf, 1894-1950.

Captain Sanders fought in the First World War and was awarded the Victoria Cross as Corporal Sanders on 1<sup>st</sup> July 1916 and the Military Cross as Captain Sanders VC on 15<sup>th</sup> December 1917.

## **DRIVING AND PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL SITE**

#### Message from our new PCSO Joy Pannu

I am the new Police Community Support Officer covering North Leamington, and including Telford Infants School. It was a pleasure to meet some of you while patrolling the roads outside of school last week.

Please could I take this opportunity to highlight some ways in which road safety can be improved outside of school. It is really important that all parents/ carers who drive to school, park safely and considerately in the local area. This will ensure that your children are as safe as possible while walking into school.

Please do not park near junctions, in front of residents' driveways, or on the yellow zig zag lines outside of school. There have been a number of 'near misses' where children have been unnecessarily put at risk through the inconsiderate driving of parents. In addition, please do not park on the kerb as this makes it difficult or impossible for parents with pushchairs or wheelchairs to get past.

School safety and parking is a local forum priority and the Police will be patrolling as much as possible throughout the schools in North Learnington to work with you in improving everyone's safety.

As mentioned by Joy above, the Community Forum Police priority, as voted by local residents, is currently school safety and parking. As part of this drive we were also visited earlier this week by two police from the Safer Neighbourhood team – Andy Whiston and Steven Sample. Andy and Steven will be making regular, unannounced visits to the local area to help make the start and end of each school day safe for everyone. If necessary police warnings will be given for unsafe parking and driving and tickets issued.

## ENHANCING SAFETY IN OUR SCHOOL LOCKDOWN

We take safeguarding and safety very seriously at Telford Infants and we continuously review all our procedures, taking into account even those events that are very unlikely to occur. As part of this process, we have introduced Lockdown procedure.

## When might we use Lockdown?

Our lockdown procedure would be used if there is a threat to the safety of children, staff and visitors in school, and when it would be safer for everyone to remain in school than to evacuate. The aim is to keep everyone safe.

Situations where our lockdown procedure may be used include:

- A potentially dangerous person or animal on the school site
- A disturbance or dangerous situation in the local community that could affect the school
- A nearby chemical incident or other risk of air pollution
- An incident related to terrorism

# **Our Lockdown procedure**

This week teachers have taken time to talk to the children about lockdown, in a similar way to how we talk with them about Fire Drills. Please be reassured that this has been at a level appropriate to Infant aged children and we have emphasised that practising procedures like this will make sure our school remains a safe place for us to learn.

Next week we will have our first Lockdown practice so that in the unlikely event of such a situation our children and staff are fully prepared. It will also provide us with an opportunity to check that the procedure we have put together is effective and make any changes if necessary. Once we have had our first practice we will have a clearer picture of how Lockdown will operate.
