## Easter activity ideas

## Go on an Easter egg hunt in the house or garden.

Can you count how many eggs you found? Can you record this by writing your results? Try and incorporate the language of 1 more and 1 less into the egg hunt. You could use tricky words or numbers in your Easter egg hunt writing words or numbers on to the eggs.

## Design an Easter egg using a repeating pattern.

This could be using a variety of materials, playdough, paper and paint, markers or pencils, loose parts like buttons or pasta shapes, collage, painting a real egg or a stone shaped like an egg.


Design and create an Easter basket and/ or bonnet using junk modelling materials or using twinkl templates.

Make Easter egg 'nest' cakes (cornflakes or shredded wheat, chocolate and mini eggs).
Ingredients:

- $225 \mathrm{~g} / 80 z$ plain chocolate, broken into pieces
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- $50 \mathrm{~g} / 2 \mathrm{oz}$ butter
- $75 \mathrm{~g} / 2^{3} / 4 \mathrm{oz}$ cornflakes
- mini chocolate eggs


Method:

- Line a 12 -hole fairy cake tin with paper cases.
- Melt the chocolate, golden syrup and butter in a bowl set over a saucepan of gently simmering water (do not let the base of the bowl touch the water). Stir the mixture until smooth.
- Remove the bowl from the heat and gently stir in the cornflakes until all of the cereal is coated in the chocolate.
- Divide the mixture between the paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set.

Design, make and write a Happy Easter card for a friend or relative that you cannot see at the moment.
